We have some outstanding speakers for our worship services this year. We'll hear from host pastor Kirk Bottomly as we convene the Assembly on Wednesday. Our preacher that night is Shane Farmer, lead pastor of Cherry Hills Community Church in Denver.

On Thursday morning, we'll hear from Troy Wilson, church planter of The Table in San Francisco. Thursday night's speaker is Mike Kuhn of World Outreach. Also that night we'll commission our new World Outreach global workers.

Finally, there's the business that we will conduct as the national church.

The Preliminary Position Paper on Human Sexuality will be considered for approval, and the Interim Committee on the Pastoral Letter on Sexuality Issues will give us an update on their work. That letter is due to us at our 2018 Assembly.
