The Nuremberg Story asks the question: What would it be like to be assigned as the first ever U. S. Army chaplain to serve Prisoners of War? Not just POW's, but the leaders of the German High Command on trial for war crimes? What could you, would you, say to people who had intentionally, willfully, systematically murdered millions of people? "The Nuremberg Chaplain" is a dynamic first-person presentation of Chaplain Henry Gerecke, who found himself ministering to the most hated men on the planet, then walking with his parishioners to the gallows. Experience his struggles to deal with his own emotions and ethics as he ministers to those the world labeled monsters.



The Dorchester Story is another award winning presentation. Dick, again in first-person, tells the story of the sinking of the troop ship Dorchester off the coast of Newfoundland, and how the four chaplains on board gave their life vests to others, before going down with the ship. The narrator tells how one of the chaplains' gave him a vest and the chance to live. (Kleenex alert for this program).



Dr. Dick Stenbakken has presented to the US Senate, the Pentagon, 35 states/provinces, and all over the world. He draws on his extensive educational (four Masters Degrees and a Doctorate in Education) and experiential background as an Army chaplain, family therapist, and pastor, to give Biblical and historical accuracy to each presentation.
